Editorial

AN EVENING WITH THE POLITICIANS

At the 3 December 2018 WRRA Committee meeting the WRRA was joined by Ben Wyatt and Hannah Beazley.

You may know Ben Wyatt as the WA State Treasurer and State Member for Victoria Park. Hannah Beazley is a Federal Labor candidate for Swan.

At the meeting both guests discussed at length local issues for the suburb of Wilson, including aircraft noise and the new runway at Perth Airport, traffic issues including congestion along Leach Highway, the Shelley Bridge, and access for Wilson residents on to Albany Highway from George Street and Fleming Road to Manning Road, and plans for the use of public land including the Castledare precinct and the former Cannington Lawn Bowls site.

The Committee would like to thank both Ben and Hannah for taking the time, after hours, to speak with the WRRA. Both politicians had a solid understanding of the issues and concerns of the residents within the local area, and commented that the issues we raised are very much in line with those of surrounding areas.

This is a logical segue to remind us that the Wilson Residents and Ratepayers' Association is here to represent you, the community of Wilson, and as an Association we can better do that if we can speak with you. So mark 7pm Monday, 4 February 2019 on your calendar and join us at the Wilson Community Hall on Braibrise Road, Wilson. so we can discuss local matters that are important to you and consider possible resolutions.

Also, the City of Canning is holding its Annual General Meeting of Electors on Wednesday 23 January 2018. This is your opportunity to voice concerns and opinions to the Council. You will be able to raise items of general business which you may wish the meeting to discuss. This is a 50% discount over the 1 Year WRRRA membership option, which recently increased to \$10 per year [to cover administration costs].

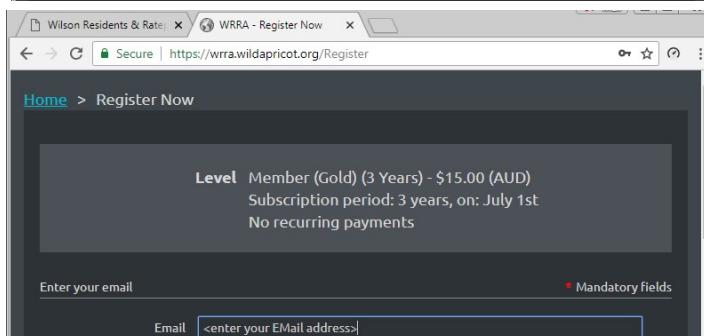
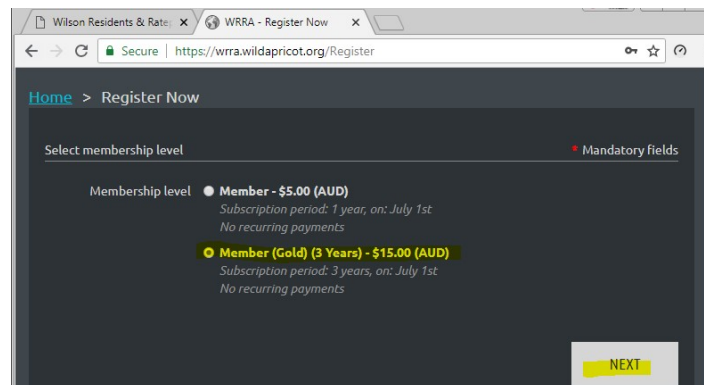
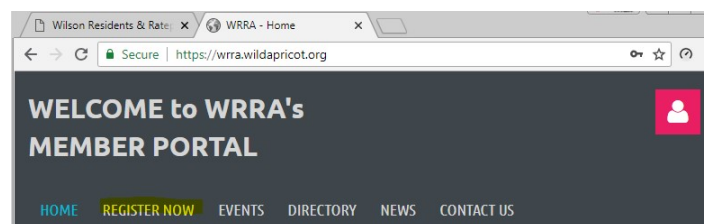

Aircraft Noise Debate Continues.

WRRRA read with interest the report in the Sunday Times, 11th November 2018 page 2, that residents of Rivervale, Belmont, and suburbs under the Runway 24 departure flight path had 'gripes' to Air Services Australia about aircraft noise due to the Airport Link Project.

During October the residents of suburbs such as Rivervale and Belmont suffered no noise and interrupted sleep from aircraft departures on any nights and mornings before 8.00am.

By comparison Wilson residents had 24 nights and 21 mornings before 8.00am with noise from aircraft departures, with 18 nights of aircraft noise at night followed by early morning.

If you are tired of and tired from aircraft noise WRRRA urges to make regular complaints to make an impact on our government representatives and Air Services Australia to give us some peace.

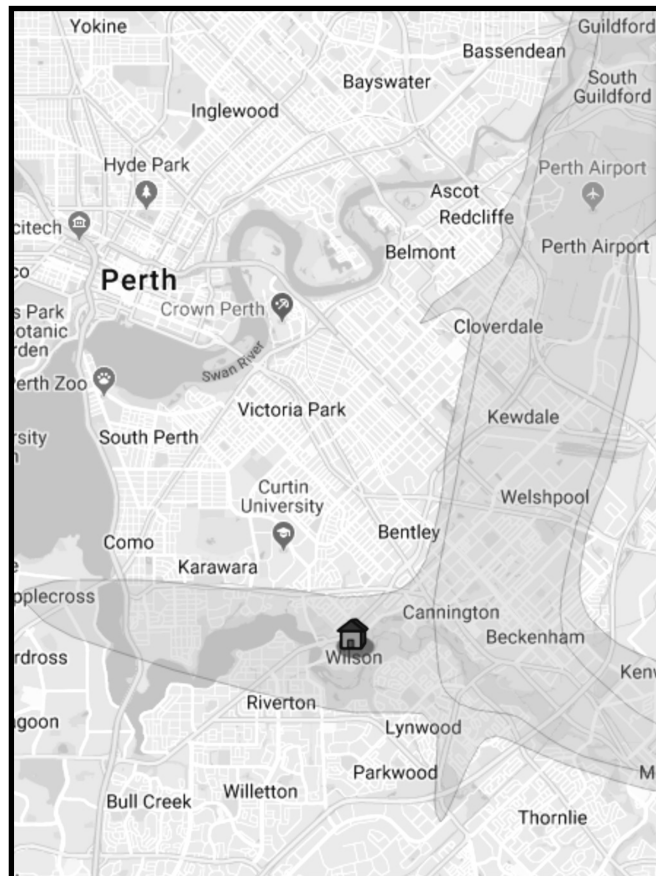

In late 2018, \$200 Citizenship Prizes were presented to both Wilson Primary School and Rehoboth Christian College—Wilson Campus. These prizes are awarded to exceptional students who display outstanding citizenship qualities.

These prizes are used to assist students and their families purchase textbooks for their studies.



This image shows the N65 contour for the areas with more than 20 and less than 49 events which are greater than 65 decibels per day. As you can see Wilson is within the contour. This data shows that Wilson is getting, on average, at least one N65 event per hour each day, with that number far greater through peak airport take-off and landing times.

Scenario modelling with the new runway at Perth Airport still shows Wilson with more than 20 and less than 49 N65 events per day in 2045. This means that Wilson is going to get no respite from aircraft noise for a long time, which is why it is important to report complaints if aircraft noise is bothering you.
