Unfortunately the problem appears to be getting even worse as more local residents switch across to 4G phones, at great expense to themselves.

Our testing has proven this issue applies to both Telstra and Optus services.

In my case, I've only just realised I'm better off switching my mobile phone back to 3G whilst I'm at home, this service is more stable.

We have been getting numerous complaints re: NBN services falling well short of expectations.

This is unacceptable, given local residents are clearly not getting the services we are paying for!





NBN: THE UNFULFILLED PROMISE

The rollout of the National Broadband Network (NBN) in the Wilson area, which promised a more reliable and faster internet service, has been anything but a successful change over from our ADSL internet services, irrespective of whom your service provider is.

The connection between the NBN network and your residence consists of a fibre optic connection from the telephone exchange to the NBN Cabinet (node) which resides anywhere from 50 to 900 metres from your residence together with the existing copper connection from the NBN node and your premises.

Unfortunately, due to combined interface faults with the aged copper residential connections, and the quality of the modems, which were installed within the residence as part of the NBN Upgrade, many of these installations experienced frequent daily drop out of the service, and in some cases no service at all within the residence either to their computer or WiFi connection to their house or mobile phones.

To make matters worse, many of our residents are located over 500 metres from the NBN Cabinet, hence they will never the get the speeds which are constantly being advertised!

TREES AND BRIDGES

In April 2016, I started a campaign to save the trees on Castledare land along Fern Road and was later informed by council that 'In relation to the trees fronting Fern Road, these are located within a Parks and Recreation classification under the Local Planning Scheme and the Metropolitan Region Scheme, where development would be strictly controlled. The Policy aims to retain trees or see the planting of new trees as part of the development process and the retention of the trees in question would be sought under the provisions of the Policy'.

Destruction of the trees commenced in 2017 and I was then informed that: 'The land is located with Swan Canning Development Control Area and the Department of Parks and Wildlife (DPAW), more specifically the Rivers and Estuaries Division, has planning responsibility for development and activity occurring within this area. The City does not have jurisdiction over this area and would only become involved if the landowner commences the process to lodge a development application. The asbestos capping works were supported by the Department of

Health and the Department of Environment and Regulation and DPAW is presently reviewing the tree removal and the associated capping works.

The city confirmed that 'no development proposal has been lodged over the land. The City's role in relation to future development proposals on this land is to provide recommendations to DPAW; the City would use the proposed Local Planning Policy LP.09 (Tree Retention and Planting) to recommend DPAW support the retention and planting of trees at certain ratios identified in the

Policv.

In total I counted the removal of 15 trees and heard that DPAW knew nothing about their destruction. I trust that the City will make sure their 'Tree Policy' ensures the replacement of these trees under any development proposal.

Recently, Steve Irons sent out a survey to his electorate. One of the options was to duplicate the Shelley Bridge. I hope all resident of Wilson will tick this option and return the survey.


